The Classlist APP

Many of you are signed up to Classlist. It is a closed, moderated app that will allow parents to talk directly to other parents in their child's class.

It will also help us to keep everyone informed of PTFA events and allows parents to become involved in specific activities and help out where they can, even if they can't make meetings.

<u>Uniform</u>: We have noticed several children wearing trainers for school. Please note that even black trainers are not school uniform. AS always they can be changed into for play time but we expect all children to wear plain black, non-fashion school shoes. It doesn't seem fair that the vast majority of children wear the correct shoes but others are perceived to be allowed to wear trainers. Oversized fashion hair accessories are reappearing and are not permitted. Please make sure your child is wearing appropriate hair accessories for school.
