World News: Coverage of Events in The Ukraine I am sure that many of you will be closely following the events in Ukraine, and whilst we are geographically far away from the events, and they are rare, some in our school and community will be directly affected and have families or roots in the region. The news and social media feeds are filled with the latest information, some of which is very upsetting and may not even be verified. If it becomes evident that any children are aware of, or interested in, the events that are happening, although we do not want to alert or worry any of the children, it may be necessary, over the coming days and weeks, to navigate them through what they have seen and heard on the news. Please be assured staff will deal with this subject sensitively and in a way appropriate to the age of the child. We have a variety of sources of information to hand, but one I felt may be of help to families at home is hosted by 'ChildNet', a UK based charity whose key aim is to give young people, families and schools the knowledge they need to safely make the most of their time online: 'Supporting your child if they see upsetting content online about what is happening in Ukraine (Childnet)'
