Barum Class - Home learning week ending 1st October

Barum class enjoyed our trip to church on Tuesday to celebrate our Harvest Festival (even if the walk was a bit soggy). We talked about how and why we show respect in a church. In English this week, we have focussed on creating noun phrases and using commas in a list and had fun acting out different verbs.

In maths, we have been learning how to estimate numbers on a number line remembering the importance of plotting the middle number to help when arranging other numbers on the line.

In RE we have started our learning about Muslim people and their faith, we have made some moon and crescent mobiles to help us remember the symbol of the Islamic faith.

Home learning: For our DT learning, we have tasted and evaluated different types of bread. The children designed their own bread roll this week, thinking about the ingredients we will need. Can you find out why we need yeast to make bread? What is yeast and why is it such an important ingredient?
