MONDAY

Talk about the story with a grown up... What do you think will happen to the goats?

WEDNESDAY

Write a sentence to go with each of the main events of the story sequencing you did yesterday 'The Billy Goats Gruff. (See attachment)

- Say the sentence you want to write outloud to your adult.
- Count the words, how many words are in your sentence?
- What word does your sentence begin with?
- Sound it outloud.
- Now find those sounds on your sound mat and begin to write them down.
- Don't forget your finger spaces.

THURSDAY

Write speech bubbles for the characters of the goats and the troll. What might they be saying to one another? Remember to sound out carefully and write your sounds down as you hear them. (See attachments)

FRIDAY

Write a description of the troll for a WANTED poster. What does he look like, how does he smell, what does he wear, how does he behave? Remember to sound out carefully and write your words leaving spaces between them.

Why wont the troll let the goats cross the bridge?

What would you do if you were one of the goats?

Make some lolly stick puppets/ characters to help you retell the story.



TUESDAY

Can you cut and stick the pictures to retell the story in the correct order. (Attachment provided)

- Now try sounding out the next word and finding the sounds on your sound mat.
- Keep going until you have sounded out each word of your sentence.
- Now finish with a full stop.

TUESDAY

Outdoors



Ask the children to build a wall and set up 10 green bottles. Each time a bottle 'accidently falls' ask the children how many have fallen and how many are standing.

Construction

Provide a selection of bricks in different sizes and shapes. Ask the children to make the tallest possible tower using 10 bricks. Which bricks will they choose? How will they place their bricks to make the tower as tall as possible?









WEDNESDAY

Class Book

Make a class counting book with a double page spread for each number 1 to 10

Stick in drawings or photographs of objects the children have collected. Discuss the different ways the children have represented each number.

THURSDAY -



Outdoors

Provide a starting line. Ask the children to take 9 giant steps, 9 tiny steps, 9 jumps, 9 tiptoes etc. How far do they travel each time? Who can travel the furthest in 9 giant steps? Who can travel the shortest distance with 9 tiny steps?








Go for a walk, collect different leaves and grasses. Look at the different shades of green.
