Positive COVID-19 Tests over the Christmas holidays

Can we please ask that you are extra vigilant regarding Covid protocol for the last few days of term and over this weekend. As a school community we have all worked very hard to keep the children safe and it would be great if they can all have a Christmas holiday without needing to self-isolate.

We will continue to monitor our admin email address for the first few days of the Christmas holidays. We ask that if any children test positive for COVID during the first four days after we break up, until Tuesday 22nd December, you contact the school on admin@bishopstawton-primary.org and provide us with the following details; your child's name, the date of the positive test and when their symptoms began. We will contact parents of children who need to isolate once we have liaised with the DfE and or SW Health Protection Team.

If your child or someone in the household develops symptoms or tests positive later on during the Christmas holiday, please ensure that they complete the full isolation period before returning to school. Email <u>admin@bishopstawton-primary.org</u> or ring the school office at the start of term to let us know that they are isolating.
